This armor system will provide officers with protection from commonly encountered rifle threats such as .223, .762, and .308. This equipment is exceptionally lightweight, thin, can be worn by officers at all times and provides superior protection against special threats. Currently, the PPPD lacks the resources to put altogether the necessary systems to effectively respond to and prevent against special threats.



WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council wish to authorize the City Manager to sign and submit an application for funding through the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program FY 2019 Local Solicitation.
